As of September 17, 2009, the remains of 5,502 individuals in 4,979 catalog numbers, 106,543 funerary objects in 2,502 catalog numbers, and 52 sacred objects and/or objects of cultural patrimony in 14 catalog numbers have been offered for repatriation by the National Museum of Natural History. Details for the remains and objects found to be culturally affiliated and that fall into repatriation categories can be found at <http://anthropology.si.edu/repatriation/reports/summaries.htm>. Of the remains and objects offered for repatriation, arrangements have been completed with Native Americans for the repatriation of the remains of 3,930 individuals, 90,215 funerary objects, and 52 sacred objects and/or objects of cultural patrimony.
